#### Parent-Teacher Interviews

Progress Report Cards (Grades 1-8) and Communication of Learning Reports (Kindergarten) will be sent home on November 21<sup>st</sup>. Grades 1 to 8 students are invited to participate in the Parent-Teacher interview. This is a wonderful opportunity for them to communicate what they are most proud of and discuss a plan to set goals for areas of growth. We look forward to seeing you and your child at Parent-Teacher interviews.

Funds raised from this initiative will be put towards the purchase of a water bottling filling station planned for the spring. The water bottling station makes it easier to fill water bottles and supports both our ECO and Healthy school initiatives. # Cross Country Team

### From the Library Learning Commons ...

This year, I am hoping that our library learning commons will not only be a hub of learning, but also a hub of social justice. To this end, I have asked students to start collecting the following items:

- Pop-can tabs
- Used Stamps
- Empty, cleaned yogurt/cottage cheese/margarine containers with lids

The tab of a standard soda can is made of high quality, high-grade aluminum. These tabs are then donated to a recycling center who pays for the tabs by the kilogram. This money is used to help make wheelchairs for children.

The fate of our collected stamps is very similar to that of the pop-can tabs. They are donated to an organization called Oxfam Canada who then sells the stamps in bulk. This money is used to "Stamp Out Poverty" around the world.

The plastic containers will be donated to Canadian Food for Children. This organization provides food to communities around the world. These containers help in the distribution of the food.

As we discuss our efforts throughout the year, we will focus on how we can all make a contribution in some way. We will try to remember the words of St. Mother Teresa, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

### Virtue Houses and Student Engagement

A tradition for some years at St. John XXIII has been our Virtue Houses. We have four Virtue Houses; Compassion, Courage, Peace and Wisdom. (You may have noticed that each of these is represented in our foyer as stained glass windows.) It's a wonderful inclusive initiative that recognizes and celebrates student engagement.

Each student in our school is part of one of the virtue houses and throughout the year, students may sit with their houses at assemblies or do activities together.

As students participate in activities in the school, such as; Terry Fox or Cross Country, they receive points that go towards their particular Virtue House. At the end of the year, at the last virtue assembly, we announce which House has accumulated the most points. In addition, students also receive a sticker for each activity they participate in. These stickers are placed on a sheet that goes home with the June report card for each child and serves as a wonderful memory of the past year.

#### 2017 School Climate Survey Results

Schools need to be safe and welcoming places so that all students feel comfortable to learn and can be successful. In support of the Board's Safe Schools and Equity and Inclusive Education policies, as well as the provincial mandate to conduct school climate surveys, each school in the Board conducted a school climate survey for students last spring. The surveys were completed anonymously online with the intention of providing students with an opportunity to share their perspective on creating an optimal safe and caring learning environment.

During the previous year, school staff and parents/guardians provided their opinions on what they believed would contribute to a caring, safe and inclusive school. Last Spring, students in Grades 4, 6 and 7 who completed the School Climate Survey identified the following as areas for celebration and improvement at St. John XIII CES:

#### What We Are Doing Well

- Students indicate that their school community makes them feel respected, welcomed, included and they feel that they get along with others.
- Students note that they work hard in school and enjoy learning.
- Students say that their school principal and teachers expects them to do good work.

#### What We Need to Improve

- Increase the capacity of staff to respond to students who experience anxiety, anger or frustration.
- Increase the capacity of staff to help students who feel stressed while at school.
- Increase the opportunities for students to develop leadership skills.

Feedback collected from the school climate surveys for students, along with other information gathered about our school, will be used at St. John XXIII, to promote peace, justice and the sacredness of life in support of student learning, achievement and well-being.

Once cancelled, buses will not be running in the afternoon. Schools rarely close, even though buses are cancelled. TV and radio stations will provide the necessary information beginning at 7:00 a.m. If you decide to drive your child to school, please consider that over the course of the day, weather conditions could worsen, and retrieving your child at the end of the day maybe particularly hazardous.

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#### York Catholic District School Board

#### ST. JOHN XXIII CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN MARKHAM (UNIONVILLE) IS OFFERING BOTH ENGLISH AND FRENCH IMMERSION CLASSES

French Immersion programs are designed to provide non-francophone children with a high degree of proficiency in the French language. While any exposure to a second language is beneficial, French Immersion broadens and deepens that exposure.

In addition to its excellent English program, St. John XXIII CES offers an Early French Immersion program. The September 2018 online application process for French Immersion will be open as of November 14, 2017.

A parent information night will be held on **Tuesday November 21, 2017**, to explain its Grade 1 French Immersion Program, with online application available from <u>Nov 14, 2017 to Jan. 25, 2018</u> at <u>www.ycdsb.ca</u>.

Transportation will be provided to French Immersion Students living within the St. John XXIII CES French Immersion Boundary.

- Students in grades 1 to grades 3, residing 1.2 km beyond the school and within the FI boundary will receive transportation.
- Students in grades 4 to grades 8, who live beyond 1.6 km and live within the French Immersion transportation boundary will receive transportation.

Students are required to walk a short distance to and from centralized bus stops.



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
