Picking up Students from the School Yard at Dismissal

The school yard is off limits to parents, guardians, and visitors during school hours from 8:40 a.m.—3:25 p.m. Parents and guardians who pick up their child(ren) from the primary and junior school yard at dismissal MUST wait behind the fence and NOT in the school yard until the dismissal bell rings at 3:25 p.m. We ask parents not to gather in the school yard before 3:25 p.m. as classes may be held outside and this causes distraction and it is not safe for the students. We thank you for respecting the children's outdoor learning time and we appreciate your cooperation and diligence in this matter.

Also, please ensure that your children are picked up promptly at 3:25. While we understand there are, at times, extenuating circumstances that may cause you to be late, these should be only be very rare occurrences.



REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

Parents are required to call the SAFE ARRIVAL LINE at 1-855-856-7862 or visit go.schoolmessenger.ca to report their child's absence.

All absences must be reported prior to 8:30 a.m. the day of the absence. Parents must obtain a confirmation number or email, or the absence has not be recorded properly.

All absences, including vacations, early leaves from school for any reason, illness, late arrivals, appointments etc., should be recorded through the Safe Arrival Line.

Students are encouraged to be on time for school. Late arrivals cause disruptions to classes that are already in session.

If your child's absence has not been reported, the system will call you to verify that your child is not at school and you will need to punch in the appropriate absence code.

Cold Weather and Indoor Recess

If the weather is extremely cold and is at or exceeds minus 17 degrees Celsius with the windchill factor, or it is stormy and icy, an indoor recess routine is followed.

INCLEMENT WEATHER ROUTINES

In the event that school transportation is cancelled due to inclement weather and/or poor road conditions:

Schools will remain open

For Parents/Guardians with children in Elementary Schools:

- Please use the <u>Safe Arrival System</u> to report if your child(ren) is absent due to inclement weather. Students who are unable to attend due to buses being cancelled, must still be reported absent using the Safe Arrival System.
- Hot Lunch programs at all YCDSB Elementary Schools are cancelled on inclement weather days.
- Please exercise discretion in deciding whether to send your child to school on inclement weather days.
- The decision to cancel school transportation service is region-wide, meaning all school buses, vans and taxis are not operating.
- Schools are open and parents/guardians can make alternate arrangements to transport their children to and from school.
- As school transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will not operate in the afternoon.
- Tests, quizzes, excursions, school programs, co-curricular activities, evening presentations, workshops, as well as parent meetings are cancelled on inclement weather days and will be rescheduled.
- Permits are cancelled on inclement weather days.
- All Continuing Education Courses scheduled during the day and evening are cancelled on inclement weather days. This includes: ESL, Secondary, and Adult Interest Courses.
- Before and After Programs in schools make every effort to remain open in inclement weather. However, the decision to open or to close early is up to the discretion of the Child Care Operator.

SNOWY DAYS, WINTER DRESS, AND ILLNESSES

Winter weather has arrived! Students must be properly dressed for the weather conditions and they need to wear boots and snow pants if they want to play in the snow. Junior and Intermediate students who do not wear boots to school on snowy days will remain on the pavement area and will not be permitted on the field. We ask that students come to school in the mornings with all their winter gear: snow pants, hats, scarves, boots and waterproof gloves, all labeled with their name. Please ensure that your child has a change of clothes, extra socks, and an extra pair of gloves at school.

Children who are too sick to go out for some fresh air at recess are too sick to attend school. A child who is ill should not be at school. If your child needs to stay in for recess a doctor's note is required. We appreciate your support in this matter.

If the weather is extremely cold (-17 degrees Celsius with the windchill factor) or stormy and icy, an indoor recess routine is followed.



STUDENTS MUST HAVE INDOOR SHOES

In order to keep our school clean, as well as assist in maintaining a healthy environment, we are asking that all students have a pair of shoes with non marking soles that are to be kept at school. Please label your child's indoor shoes with their name.
